

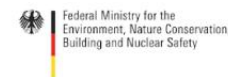

WHAT IS BES-NET?



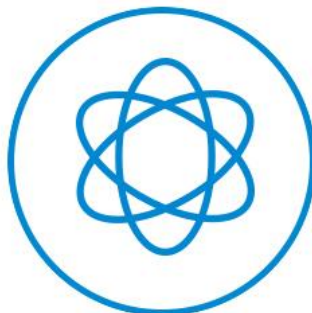

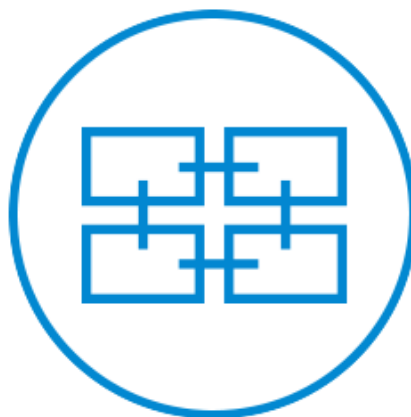

3. Build a common agenda for action.

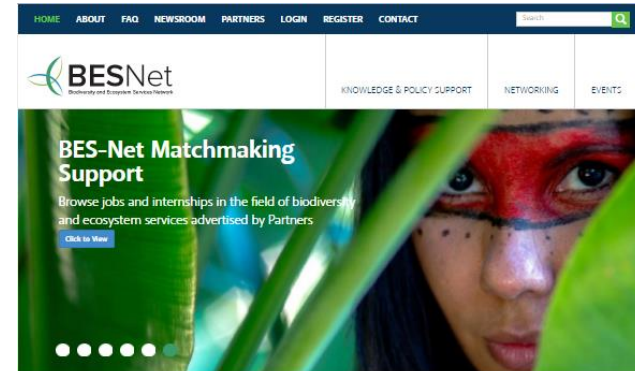
